

Madhya Pradesh Heritage Tour

Duration: 6 Nights/7 Days

Destinations Covered: Gwalior - Orchha - Khajuraho - Datia - Chanderi - Gwalior

Day 1: Gwalior-

You arrive in Gwalior today. Gwalior is famous for one of the finest living forts in India. Within the fort walls are interesting temples, museums and palaces. The museum collection includes several royal memorabilia like three-and-a-half ton chandeliers, not to mention a carpet the size of a couple of tennis courts and a silver model train, which once chugged on miniature rails round the royal dinner table laden with decanters and cigars. You will be staying in Gwalior tonight.

Day 2: Gwalior - Orchha-

Depart for Orchha today early morning. You will be staying in Orchha tonight.

Day 3: Orchha-

Orchha is a small town on the bank of river Betwa and is famous for temples that are built by its Bundela rulers in the 16th and 17th centuries and still retain much of their pristine perfection. You will be staying overnight in Orchha.

Day 4: Orchha - Khajuraho-

In the morning, you will depart for Khajuraho. You will reach Khajuraho in the evening. Enjoy the light show in Khajuraho. You will be staying overnight in Khajuraho.

Day 5: Khajuraho-

In the morning after breakfast, embark on a guided tour of Khajuraho. Start with the visit to group of famous Chandela dynasty temples. These temples are worldwide known for their spectacular erotic sculptures and carvings depicted in them. The Western Group of temples that are dedicated to Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu includes the KandariyaMahadeva temple, the Matangeshwar temple, the Lakshmana temple, and the Varaha temple. Spend overnight at the hotel.



Day 6: Khajuraho - Chanderi-

After breakfast, hit the road to go towards Chanderi to visit its major historic attractions, which may include Chanderi fort, BadalMahal Gate etc. Overnight stay.

Day 7: Chanderi - Datia - Gwalior-

After the breakfast, enroute to Datia. Datia is positioned close to Gwalior and is spotted with handsome palaces and gardens. The most eminent of which is the palace of Bir Singh Deo built in the 17th century.

After Datia visit followed by the drop to Gwalior for Departure
