



Maihar and Chitrakoot Pilgrimage Tour

Duration: 2 Nights/3 Days

Destinations Covered: Satna – Maihar – Chitrakoot - Satna

Day 1: Departure to Satna-

In the Morning after breakfast departure to Maihar Temples.

It is a common belief that first fall Adiguru Shankracharya offered his prayer and worship in this temple. The famous historian A. Cunningham has done a detailed Study of this temple. He dates the stone inscription to 9th or 10th century A.D. In 1922 some joins pilgrims inspired king Brajnath Singh Judev to ban offering of animal sacrifice in the temple. Statues of Sri Kalbhairav, Bhagwan Narsingh, Hanuman ji, Goddess Mother Kali, Durga, Sri Gauri Shankar, Sheshnag, Phoolmati Mata, Bramhdev & Jalappadevi are also installed in Sharda Devi temple campus. Move to visit Maa Sharda Devi Temple in the evening, after darshan move to Satna (35 Kms), Check in hotel, Night stay.

Day 2: Satna - Chitrakoot Dham-

Today after breakfast departure to Chitrakoot Dham (82 kms). Arrival Chitrakoot Dham after 2-3 hours, visit Ramghat, Kamadgiri, Sati Anusuya, Sphatik Shila, Janaki Kund, Hanuman Dhara, Bharat. In the evening return back to the hotel at Satna and night stay.

Day 3: Satna-

In the morning after breakfast check out from the hotel and leave for local Sightseeing of Satna and departure, the tour concludes with sweet memories. The Satna District is part of the region of Bagelkhand, a large part of which was ruled by the state of Rewa. A small part of Satna was ruled by feudatory chiefs, holding their states under the British Raj. Satna's name comes from the Satna River (or Sutna) which originates at Sarang Ashram (Sutikshna Ashram), situated near Sarangpur village in the Panna district. Tour ends here.
